Subordinating
conjunctions
connect
independent
and
dependent clauses.




An independent clause is a group of words that can stand alone as a sentence.



Independent Clause:

Dr. Max works
here.




Independent Clause:

We heal sick
people.



Doctors and nurses need as much information as possible. We love dependent clauses because they give us more information about the main clause!

Subordinating conjunctions introduce dependent clauses.




A dependent clause can't stand alone as a single sentence. It relies on an independent clause to give it meaning.

A dependent clause starts with a **subordinating conjunction** and is also called a **subordinate clause**.
